


Historians!

Vocabulary Chronology

BC

B.C. does stand for "before Christ," but A.D. actually stands for the Latin phrase anno domini, which means "in the year of our Lord."



Can be drawn on a timeline (see below).

Roman Britain 43AD- 410

Romans founded Londinium soon after they invaded.

60AD burnt to the ground by Boudicca, leader of the Iceni tribe fighting against the Romans.

Rebuilt by the Romans with wall around it to protect it from further invasion.

The area inside became known as the Square Mile or the City. Today it is the financial hub of the UK.

History of London Timeline

Tudors 1485 - 1603

Henry VII takes to the throne, the Population of London is 75.000

Several outbreaks of the plaque.

Victorians 1837 - 1901

During 19th Century population increases to six

1836 First railway is built London Bridge to Greenwich







They were **responsible** for enforcing laws, keeping their citizens safe and making sure that Egypt's land was peaceful and providing crops.


The 'Boy King': Tutankhamun

He became pharaoh in 1333 BC.

Tutankhamun became **pharaoh** at the age of 9.

He died unexpectedly at the age of 19.


