Maths

Last term we focused on language: match, sort, more, fewer, tall, short. This term we will continue to develop children's understanding of these words. This term we are looking at making amounts of 1-5, one more, one less and 2D shapes.

PD (Physical development)

There are two key targets we would like the children to achieve this term:

- -Correct pencil grip (tripod hold)
- -Correct scissor hold

These skills are fundamental to their progress in school.

UW (understanding the world)

This term we are exploring similarities and differences of key celebrations (Bonfire night, Diwali, birthdays, Christmas) Our outcome is for the children to understand that everybody celebrates differently and that we may not all celebrate the same things. We hope that they can start to use words such as similar and different at dinner table discussions!
