

1. Think of an island you would like to create later in the term. You need to draw a diagram what you think it will look like and begin collecting resources to make it (this could be card, newspaper, old clothes etc.).

**(This must be done before September 26<sup>th</sup>).**

2. Choose a piece of music which you believe reflects the mood of the island in *The Tempest* (think about the pace, the instruments used and if it changes much throughout). Explain why you have chosen that song, and why it reflects the island. Would it be slow and steady or loud and fast like a storm? It could be classical, pop or even rock music!

4. Write a book review of a book you have read recently (it doesn't have to be your favourite!) It must be at least three paragraphs. Include:

- A summary of what happens.
- Your favourite part of the book and why.
- Who you would recommend it to and why.
- Three interesting words you learned and a definition of them.

6. Sketch a picture of yourself as if you have been stranded on a desert island for a year. How do you think you will look? Just use pencil.

8. Try one or both of the Maths challenges on the separate sheet.

## Maths Challenge 8:


Choose one of these challenges! (I'll be really impressed if you can get both done!)
